## THE CHANGING LANDSCAPE OF STATE AND FEDERAL DATA PRIVACY LAW

In 2022, Connecticut and Utah joined California, Colorado, and Virginia in passing comprehensive data privacy legislation. A variety of other bills have been filed in other states. A bipartisan federal bill appears to offer the best chance of passing a national bill in recent memory.
