



## NAAG/NAGTRI FINANCIAL HARDSHIP POLICY

The National Association of Attorneys General (NAAG) is the nonpartisan national forum for America's state and territory attorneys general. NAAG provides a community for attorneys general and their staff to collaboratively address issues important to their work, as well as training and resources to support attorneys general in protecting the rule of law and the United States Constitution.

The National Attorneys General Training and Research Institute (NAGTRI) is the research and training arm of NAAG. NAGTRI strives to provide high-quality, nonpartisan, and innovative training, research and resources to state and territory attorney general offices.

Most NAGTRI courses are scholarship-based, thanks to the support of the NAAG Mission Foundation. In the event that NAAG or NAGTRI sponsors a fee-based meeting, NAAG scholarships are available upon request when an applicant provides evidence of a financial hardship, such as a state government employee travel ban or lack of state office training funds. For courses over \$500, qualifying attorneys will receive at least a 50% price reduction.
