3:10 pm – 4:10 pm	<p><b>The Role of States in Internet Policy</b></p> <p>Federalism plays a valuable role in providing for laboratories for democracy, particularly when the federal government is unable or unwilling to legislate. In the case of Internet policy, there is an increasing trend of state regulation of a range of topics, ranging from public safety (addressing online sales of retail theft and fentanyl sales) to protecting victims (addressing revenge porn) to consumer data privacy to protecting children from mental health harms from social media. Moreover, where there is federal action and leadership, including on the broadband infrastructure program and guidance on artificial intelligence, the federal government is looking to and respecting the important role of states.
