## AGs Addressing the Evolving Landscape of Pharmacy Benefit Managers

Ohio has been at the forefront of litigation involving pharmacy benefit managers ("PBM's") for the past 8 years. Under AG Yost's leadership, Ohio has recovered over \$100m from PBM's in cases involving overcharging of state entities. The proposed panel would discuss the latest phenomenon in this litigation - rebate aggregators. In recent years, PBM's have spun off their rebate arms into separate entities, with each PBM having one: Express Scripts has Ascent, Optum has Emisar, CVS has Zinc. The creation of these entities was in response to a threat to eliminate the safe harbor provisions in the antikickback statute for PBM's. Essentially, these rebate aggregators charge "fees" to the manufacturer which are really the rebate monies that are due to the plan sponsors. Rather than passing these rebates back to the plan sponsors, rebate aggregators skim off a portion as fees. Manufacturers are forced to pay an increasing amount of "fees," really rebates, in exchange for favorable

placement on the formulary. Under most PBM contracts, PBM's are required to pass all rebates back to the plan. These fees drive up the price of pharmaceuticals as manufacturers must pay an increasing amount of fees to the PBM rebate aggregators. This panel will explore this problem and the litigation thus far to address the problem.
