#### Session 3 - Debt Collection Issues

Debt collection lawsuits are on the rise: in 2024, filings in many states exceeded pre-pandemic levels. At the same time, recent research in some states has concluded that medical and consumer debt plaintiffs are not complying with laws intended to ensure that they own the debt, are suing the right consumer, and are within the statute of limitations. A panel including consumer advocacy and debt collection industry organizations will discuss this topic including how AGOs can use court data to identify enforcement needs in their states and the debt collection protections available through state and federal law.
