### 10:50 am - 12:00 pm Firearm Safety and Enforcement Strategies

Across the country, states are utilizing a range of legal and investigative tools to prevent the spread of illegal firearms and to promote overall public and community safety. From civil enforcement and litigation to partnerships with law enforcement and local prosecutors, attorneys general have taken steps to address gun trafficking, ghost guns, and the rising use of illegally obtained firearms in violent crime and against law enforcement officials. This panel will highlight practical approaches such as proactive investigations and crossagency coordination that help reduce gun-related violence, support public safety, and hold actors who violate the law accountable, whether they are manufacturers, traffickers, or online sellers. New Jersey's SAFE Office will be featured as one example of an integrated enforcement model.
